Time to Start School? If you have a child born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019, then now is the time to apply for a place at a Catholic primary school in the Diocese. You must complete an application form (either online or on paper) that is available from the school admissions team of your local Council, for admission during the 2023-24 school year. If your child has been baptised, you must also provide a copy of the baptism certificate to your preferred school. Please ensure you apply by the closing date of 15 January 2023.

## MEMORIAL OF ST LEO THE GREAT – 10<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER

Elected Pope in 440, Leo consolidated the organization of the

Church and the government from Rome at a time of civil and doctrinal disorder. The Council of Chalcedon in 451 restated the doctrine of the incarnation and the primacy of Peter. He was a man of clear and forceful intellect and faith. He died about 461.

## MEMORIAL OF SAINT MARTIN OF TOURS, BISHOP – 11<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER

Born in 316, Martin began as a soldier, but then received baptism at the age of 18 and later founded a monastery in France under the direction of Saint Hilary. He was later chosen as Bishop of Tours; here he worked hard to visit his flock, and preach against paganism. Once, while on horseback in Amiens in Gaul (modern France), he encountered a beggar. Having nothing to give but the clothes on his back, Martin cut his heavy officer's cloak in half and gave it to the beggar. Later he had a vision of Christ wearing the cloak. This incident became iconographic of Martin. He died in 397, and was honoured as a saint – one of the first non-martyrs so to be honoured.

## MEMORIAL OF SAINT JOSAPHAT, BISHOP, MARTYR – 12<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER

1580-1623. Josaphat was a Catholic of the Ruthenian rite, born in the then Polish region of Lithuania of Orthodox parents. He became a Catholic and a Ukrainian Basilian monk. Chosen Bishop, he worked for the unity of the Church until he suffered martyrdom at the hands of an angry mob in Russia.
